## VERMONT STATUTES, REVISION OF 1947 Chapter 163 Town Meetings

3499. Qualifications of Voters; A male or female citizen, twenty-one years of age, who has taken the freeman's oath and whose list, including poll, is taken in a Town at the annual assessment proceeding a town meeting, and whose poll and old age assistance taxes due such town, were paid prior to January 1 preceding such town meeting, or who has attained the age of twenty-one years subsequent to the last annual assessment and resided in the town since April 1 last preceding, or who is exempt from taxation for any cause, shall be a voter in town meeting while residing in such town.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

We the Selectmen of the Town of Clarendon submit the following Report.

At the first meeting of the Board of Selectmen Charles Ruane was appointed Chariman for the ensuing year.

The following officers were appointed:

Richard Pratt, Robert J. Pratt and Henry Potter—Fence Viewers.

George Ridlon and Isadore LaVictoire—Pound Keepers.

Howard Pierce—Inspector of Lumber, Shingles and Wood.

John H. Pratt-Weigher of Coal.

Harold E. Johnson—Tree Warden.

The Selectmen and Road Commissioner met with the District Road Commissioner in June to plan summer road work. As a result the Walker Mt. Road was completed except for Black Top which will probably be applied during the coming summer. Plans were also made for repairing and resurfacing other Town roads, for installing culverts and for patching and retreating Black Top.

A culvert was laid under the Alfrecha railway crossing in North Clarendon by agreement with the railroad company the Town paid for the culvert, the Company did the work of installing same. The road leading to the culvert was ditched. This project was undertaken to prevent flooding and ice on the roads at the intersection of the Middle Road and Alfrecha cross roads, causing damage and inconvenience to people living in that locality. Total cost to the Town was \$540.64.

At a special Town Meeting held on May 4, 1955 it was voted to buy land of George Ridlon for a new school at North Clarendon. Accordingly the land was purchased. A right of way to this property was obtained from Otter Creek Grange. In return for this right of way the Town agrees to furnish water for use of the Grange from the well which will eventually be drilled for the school. On June 21 the Selectmen, George Holden representing the Grange and George Ridlon met and signed deeds and agreements above mentioned.

The Selectmen and Martha Weeks, representing the Board of School Directors met to discuss and make plans for the repairs and improvements to be made on the Clarendon Flats School Rooms as voted at the last Town Meeting. They decided to drill

a well and put running water and toilets into the schools first and make other improvements as the money voted (\$5000.00) permitted. The Selectmen turned the project over to the School Board. The well was drilled. An addition was built on the west side of the building for the toilets. A new floor was laid in the north room and storm windows put on. The total cost was \$5,460.12—(Labor \$1,270.26, drilling well \$1,568.75, electric pump, septic tank, toilets etc. \$1,149.28, lumber, concrete and other material \$1,449.08, digging ditch \$22.75).

The wood shed no longer used at the Flats School was moved and added to the shed built last year for salt. This will make more room for storage of Town supplies.

During the summer a new gate was purchased for the Chippenhook Cemetery, and head stones were repaired and set up and some brush cut in Chippenhook Cemetery and the cemetery at Clarendon Flats.

The Town roads have been bad this winter particularly because of ice. The cost of winter maintenance is accordingly high. Already a carload of road salt has been used and another half carload is now being used. The usual amount of sand has already been used. A comparison of the amounts of sand and salt used this year with that used last follows:

1954-1955—sand 576 yds. salt 32 tons. 1955-1956—sand 890 yds. salt 54 tons.

Added to this is the amount which the State pays the Town for State Aid on road work for the use of the truck and grader.

#### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING PROGRAM VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

#### January 1, 1955 to January 1, 1956

Using vaccine furnished by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, first and second grade children whose parents gave permission received the immunization of polio vaccine in school this year. The Vermont Health Department cooperated with the Foundation on this project and gave technical supervision and equipment to administer the vaccine. Through the cooperation of many individuals, these immunization clinics were successful. Twelve children will be eligible for the third dose of the polio vaccine.

Services rendered by the Public Health Nurse are as follows:

37 individuals were contacted by the Public Health Nurse

24 individuals for the Maternal and Child Health Services

9 individuals for the Communicable Disease Service

176 visits were made for the P. H. Nursing Program

73 visits for Maternal and Child Health

12 visits for Communicable Disease

21 visits for other types of services

Clinics and Medical Conferences

2 School Medical Conferences 25 children were examined

4 Special School Conferences

23 children were rechecked by the Public Health Nurse for vision and hearing.

22 children were vaccinated

Diphtheria & Tetanus

8 children received two doses

11 children received booster doses

Letters and permission cards will be issued in the near future for the parents to sign for infant, preschool and school children through fourteen years of age to receive the polio vaccine. Clinics are made possible by funds provided to the Vermont Department of Health.

# VERMONT DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE Montpelier, Vermont

This is our twentieth annual report to the citizens of the Town of Clarendon on State payments in your municipality of various types of assistance and welfare during 1955.

The total number of recipients in the State has remained reasonably stable for four years. The number aided in the Totally and Permanently Disabled program has continued to increase. Old Age Assistance and Blind Assistance case loads have declined. The impact of the Social Security Insurance programs have not been fully realized in Vermont but will be a continuing factor in the reduction of case loads as an increasing number of our people attain a fully insured status. At the present time less than 50% of the aged population in Vermont, sixty-five years or over, are entitled to Social Security benefits. The towns and cities participated financially in two of the programs as indicated below. Administrative expenses for the four types of Public Assistance have always been among the lowest in the nation.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Directors and the Citizens of Clarendon:

I submit my third annual report as your Superintendent of Schools:

The Clarendon Schools opened on Wednesday, September 7, 1955, with the same teachers as last year. Enrollment by schools was as follows:

The physical conditions of our schools are still the big problem facing your School Directors and Superintendent. It is fortunate that we are able to have the same teachers as last year continue their leadership again.

Some progress is being made in improving conditions under which your children work and live in their schools. The town hall at the Flats now has running water and flush toilets. The north room has a new floor and storm windows have been added. This has greatly improved conditions for the children there.

New toilets are going to be installed at the Springs School.

It is hoped that the proposal for a three-classroom building at North Clarendon will be approved by the voters during February. This will eliminate two old schools, Hill and North Clarendon Grammar, and also the need of renting space in the Grange Hall.

The East School and Chippenhook should then be provided with running water and flush toilets as soon as possible. The lighting should be improved in the East School and the primary room furnished with facilities for coat space and for storage and work areas,

Your School Directors have prepared a budget for the school year begin ning July 1, 1956 and ending June 30, 1957, which is shown on another page. A school tax of \$3.65 is recommended by them to meet the necessary expenses of your School Department. At the last town meeting, a school tax of \$3.10 was voted after a \$3.65 tax had been recommended. A deficit will probably result again this June. An adequate school tax to enable the schools to meet current operating expenses is good business.

In addition to the need for an adequate school tax, there is a necessity of turning over to the School District the gross amount of the school tax by December 31 of each year in order to comply with the law. If this practice is not followed, Clarendon's State Aid could be endangered.

The legal voters of the Town of Clarendon, Vt. and the Town School District are hereby notified and warned to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 6, 1956 at 10 A. M., Standard Time, to act on the following articles:

- 1. To choose a Moderator.
- 2. To act on the reports of the Town Officers.
- 3. Shall one or two Road Commissioners be elected by ballot or appointed by the Selectmen?
- 4. To elect all necessary Town Officers.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money for Town Highways and how much.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money to take advantage of State Highway Law and Resurfacing, and if so how much.
- 7. Shall the Town vote a sum of money up to \$2,000.00 for new Black Top?
- 8. Shall the Town vote a sum of money up to \$2,500.00 for Retreatment?
- 9. Shall the Town give the Library Association \$25.00 for the purchase of children's books?
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to pay more than the minimum tuition for High School students.
- 11. To see if the Town will pay the taxes to the Town Treasurer.
- 12. Shall licenses for the sale of malt and vinous beverages be granted in this Town?
- 13. Shall spirituous liquors be sold in this Town?

  The vote under articles 12 and 13 shall be by ballot in form as provided by this act. Such ballots are furnished by the Secretary of State.
- 14. Shall the Town employ a State Auditor to audit the books?
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the temporary use of the Town.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to build a new bridge in Clarendon Springs near the McCormack Quarry. If the cost of the bridge is \$30,000.00 the State will pay \$24,000.00.
- 17. To see what tax the Town will vote to pay current expenses.
- 18. To see what tax the Town will vote to pay the expenses of the Town Schools.
- 19. To transact any other business lawful to be done at said meeting.
